A comfort zone is a psychological state in which a person feels secure, comfortable or in control with very little anxiety and stress BUT the sooner you step away from your comfort zone, the sooner you realise it wasn't all that comfortable. Comfort zone is a settled method of working which requires little effort and yields barely acceptable results. The more time we spend outside the comfort zone, the more we achieve.

An excellent example of the infinite capability of human power to come out of the comfort zone is KarolyTakacs of the Hungarian Army. He was the top pistol shooter in the world who was expected to win the gold in the 1940 Olympics. While training, a hand grenade exploded in his hand and it was blown off, shattering all his dreams. The easiest option was to quit shooting but Takacs was made of stronger stuff .He pushed himself out of his comfort zone, learnt to shoot with his left hand and won the gold medal in the 1948 and 1952 Olympics.

West Indies spinner Sunil Narine was touted as the biggest surprise of IPL 10(2017) season-he had been suspended from bowling in international cricket for illegal action in 2015. He came back with a remodelled action in IPL 10 .Even as his bowling was being worked out, Sunil fashioned himself into an opening batsman by coming out of his comfort zone and hitting the fastest 50 in IPL history (Yusuf Pathan also holds the record). Muthiah Muralitharan, another bowler who had to work a lot on his action, said-lt is never easy for any bowler to succeed after making changes but Sunil and Muralitharan did so.

Scientifically, it has been proven that trying to do new things increases levels of dopamine in the brain which is part of the brain's reward centre. Novelty has been shown to improve memory too. Daniel H. Pink, the author of "Drive-The surprising thing about what motivates us" says-We all need a place of productive discomfort, if you are too comfortable you are not productive. PM Sh. Modiji, in his Mann ki Baat in April 2017, urged the youth of the country to step out of the comfort zone and try something exciting in the Summer Vacation. He urged the youth to explore new talents, skills and places. India ranks 66th on the Global Innovation Index list, while the US is first. Even successful Indian start-ups have based their business model on proven Western businesses-Flipkart on Amazon, Ola on Uber etc. We need to come out of our comfort zone and innovate more because that is how civilizations evolve. Get comfortable being uncomfortable. Ashton Kutcher, the Hollywood actor says", I am continuously trying to make choices against my own comfort zone.
