## **Emergent Role of Women in Management**

"Women are leaders everywhere you look-from the CEO who runs a Fortune 500 company to the housewife who raises her children and heads her household. Countries have been built by strong women, and we will continue to break down walls and defy stereotypes." - Nancy Pelosi (American politician serving as speaker of the United States House of Representatives since January 2019)

The role of women worldwide is undergoing a dramatic change. Women today share the podium with men in almost all fields, be it kitchen or in defense. Same is the case in the field of Management. Women held under a quarter (24%) of senior business roles across the world in 2018 and 75% of businesses had at least one woman in senior management Today, India is a power in the global economy, with a high demand for talent. One of the key sources of this talent is educated Indian women. While Indian corporations have not yet fully recognized or utilized this talent pool, the growing gender diversity in Indian managerial ranks now offers a bright pathway for change for Indian women.

Historically, India has been a male dominated society, yet, in the past two decades or so, social change has opened the possibility for women to attain managerial roles in corporate sector of India. The U.S. business magazine Forbes published its list of "The 100 Most Powerful Women 2018", in which a number of Indian business women are placed: Roshni Nadar Malhotra CEO of HCL, Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw, Chairman, Biocon, Shobana Bhartiya, chairperson and editorial director for India's largest listed media company, HT Media.

As more Indian women enter the workforce, particularly in the corporate world, this change is in dramatic contrast to the traditional Indian culture. Working women are no longer a rarity and are now accepted as an integral part of the working force. Indian organizations have experienced a steady increase in the number of women employees and this pattern is bound to continue in the future as well. Women have recently begun to join the ranks of managers in large numbers. But women at the top management positions are still a rare species. According to a global survey by Grant Thornton - Women in Business: New Perspectives on Risk and Reward, 17 percent of senior roles are held by women in India which is 7 points higher than the last year. But as opposed to the world statistics, nearly half of the Indian Women leave the workforce between junior and middle management levels.

Social expectations in India, the roles expected of a man as the bread-winner, and a woman as the home maker, have been redefined. Yet, just like many career women in Western countries, Indian women struggle with work/life balance. India still has strong traditional social expectations, and not all women can easily juggle both family obligations and a professional career. Cultural and societal change means a shift away from traditional views, stereotypes and societal attitudes, with increasing opportunities for Indian women in management. Gandhi ji had once so appropriately said: "To call woman the weaker sex is a libel; it is man's injustice to woman. If by strength is meant brute strength, then, indeed woman is less brute than man. If by strength is meant moral power, then woman is immeasurably man's superior. Has she not greater intuition, is she not more selfsacrificing, has she not greater powers of endurance, has she not greater courage? Without her, the world could not be."

The 2017 World Bank report states that an increase in the participation rate of women from the current 27 percent to 50 percent could boost India's overall growth rate by 1.5 percent. McKinsey Global Institute has done further research to show that in India, women's contribution to the GDP stands at just 18 percent, far behind China, where women contribute to 41 percent of the total GDP. If McKinsey's estimates are accurate, India can add a mind-boggling \$770 billion to its GDP annually simply by achieving gender parity in the workforce!
