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## "All is well that ends well"

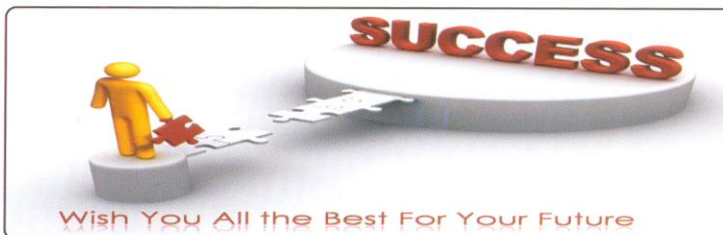

Like to do things to help people -- like, teaching, nursing or providing information; are good for jobs like lawyer, counselor, social worker, librarian, etc..

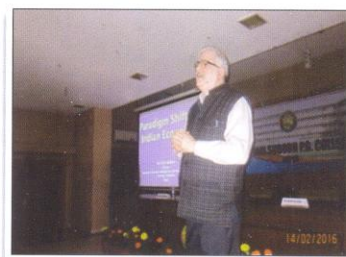
#### Enterprising

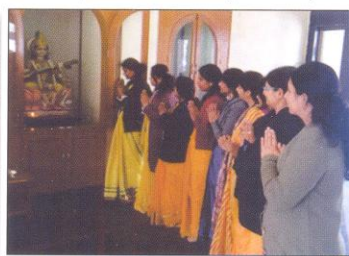

## One web for all (Net Neutrality)

A few months ago, the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) has rejected Facebook's 'Free Basics' scheme. But If anybody thinks that the battle is over and the issue is settled, they are clearly wrong. The issue was not just some schemes like Facebook's 'Free Basics' or Airtel's 'Airtel zero' but the main issue is the freedom of internet and how differential pricing is trying to interrupt that.

Net Neutrality means Internet that allows and protects free speech i.e. your Internet Service Providers (ISP's) should allow access to all content and should not block any applications or websites that ride over those networks. Just as your phone company is not allowed to decide that to whom are you going to call and what are you allowed to say on that call, your Internet service provider (ISP) should not be concerned with the content or data you view or post online.

Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) forbids differential tariffs for data services by calling them discriminatory and has ordered that:

- Services like Facebook's 'Free Basics' and Airtel's 'Airtel Zero' will be stopped immediately.

- Telecom companies are no longer allowed to subsidize in house content or make deals with certain websites or application providers for giving their services free or at discount.
- TRAI will also levy penalty of Rs.50000 a day for discriminating tariffs, subject to a maximum of Rs.50lakhs.

With effect of these orders from TRAI, telecom companies will have to eliminate hundreds of tariff plans that allow free or subsidized access to some websites and applications like Facebook, Twitter, Whatsapp etc.

Some laws for net neutrality should be made, so that strategies of Internet Service Providers that are based and intended solely with the motive of profit making can be restricted. Also, government should focus on providing subsidized access to those who cannot afford it and Internet access in rural access is also a matter of concern that should be taken care of. And in the context of Net Neutrality, it is rightly said that:

"The importance of Net Neutrality is that Innovation can come from Everyone".

## Tiger Mom

Every child is different. What works for one may not work for the other. Too much pressure can be detrimental for a child. Let the flowers blossom naturally. A child's self-esteem is paramount and it wilts under excessive pressure. It's about believing in your child more than anything else and helping him realise his/her potential. God has charted out a path for all of us and eventually He would lead us there. Above all, the desire to excel has to come from within, it cannot be forced.

## Mobile Etiquettes

The title sounds to be a little basic. We all have been talking on the mobile since childhood days but there are few norms that we need to follow in order to create a better impression in the mind of listener. There are a few suggested guidelines (not rules) that help us to sound more professional & formal.

**Smile:** Smile cannot be seen but can be sensed, so try to have pleasant expression on your face while you talk.

**Enthusiasm:** The listener cannot see you so your voice will definitely express how you feel. So it is important that you sound enthusiastic and genuinely interested in the call.

**Greeting:** Greeting the listener on call make him/her comfortable and interested in your call.

**Tone:** The tone substitutes facial expression on a phone call. So try to use your tone accordingly.

**Eating:** Never make a call while eating or chewing something, it is considered ill mannered.

**Voice:** Try to make your voice pleasant & clear while calling.

**Using phone speaker:** Before using speaker, inform the listener and take permission.

**Read before calling:** Be clear about objective, keep documents pen and message pad ready.

**Jargon:** As far as possible avoid using colloquial language or use of jargon or abbreviations because the listener may not be familiar with it.

**Ringtone:** The Ringtone should not be too loud or annoying because it may disturb others.

**Goodbye:** At the end of the call, try to say Goodbye or have a nice day or any other Goodbye note.
