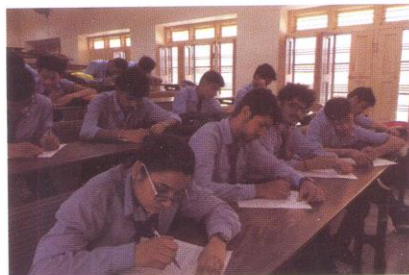

Classroom activities are an integral part of teaching-learning methodology at Subodh College. After Dusshera holidays, the



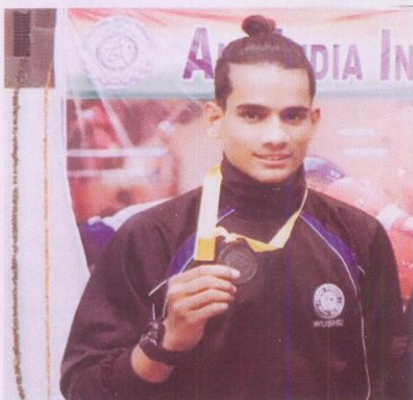

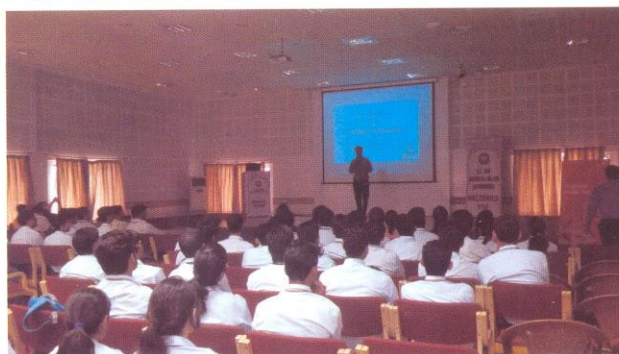

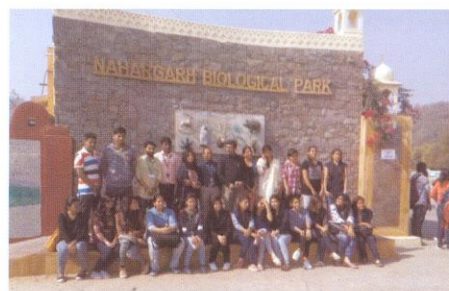


NGO Activity : Pahal

Chunking - Break a long list of numbers or any other type of information into smaller pieces or chunks.

Method of loci - Loci means "places". With this method each word to be learnt is imagined to be located in a particular place.

Creative Hues***Yeh Dil Maange More.....***

On September 29, 2016, we woke up to the news of surgical strikes. Most of us felt a sense of triumph-the killing of 17 soldiers in Uri has been avenged. As the daughter of an Army Officer, I have seen army life from close quarters. Some politicians questioned the authenticity of the strikes and demanded proof. I request them to ask this question to the mother who lost her only son or to the mother who sent her two daughters to school for their exam on the day her soldier husband's body was to be received, because he would have wanted so. The courage and fortitude of these women are amazing. In spite of their personal tragedy and grief, they resolve to send their children to the army to serve the nation.

Over the years we have seen many attacks happen-The Kargil War in which our land was occupied by their army. It gave us exemplary idols that went as mere men, came back as heroes-in coffins. It all started with the third degree torture of Capt. Sourabh Kalia and his team whose mutilated bodies were sent back to India and to this day justice has not been granted. Capt Vikram Batra, Maj. Manoj Pandey, Lt. Vijayant Thapar, to name a few, laid down their lives in the war. Lt. Vijayant's father, Col. Thapar, climbed 16000 ft to the place his son fought his last battle to honour his last wish. He did this annual pilgrimage for 10 years.

Then came the attack on the Parliament, 26/11 Mumbai blasts, Pathankot air base attack and now the Uri strikes. Hemant Karkare, Sandeep Unnikrishnan, Gursewak Singh, Lt. Col. Niranjana were the heroes of these attacks. The supreme sacrifice of these martyrs is being belittled by certain people who want cultural exchanges between the countries. If their artists are supporting their country, every Indian must steadfastly support India. Inaugurating Shaurya Samarak, a war memorial dedicated to the Indian soldiers in Bhopal on 14th Oct, 2016, PM Narendra Modi said -"In some countries whenever people see jawans at airports or railway stations, they stand up and applaud; we should also adopt this."

The soldier risking his life at LOC must know that the entire country is standing solidly with him.

As the epitaph at Kohima war memorial in Nagaland says

*When you go home, tell them of us and say,
For your tomorrow, we gave our today*
